Dr Lucas Lixinski is Associate Professor at Faculty of Law, UNSW Sydney. He researches and publishes primarily in the areas of international cultural heritage law and international human rights law. He has over 90 publications, including top journals in the field like *The American Journal of International Law*, the *European Journal of International Law*, the *Leiden Journal of International Law*, and *The Italian Yearbook of International Law*. In addition, he is the author of two monographs published by Oxford University Press, the latest one being *International Heritage Law for Communities: Exclusion and Re-Imagination* (2019). He is also Vice-President (Conference) of the Association of Critical Heritage Studies, and Rapporteur of the International Law Association Committee on Participation in Global Heritage Governance. While at UNIMIB, he will be working on a book manuscript on how cultural heritage law shapes the possibilities of identity and pluralism in post-conflict and -dictatorship contexts (transitional justice).
